## A Letter from Carla Cooper, COHI Devlopment Advisor

We are delighted to announce that COHI has been awarded another challenge grant for 2016! Our generous donor was very pleased with how well we responded to last year's challenge and commended us for both "the hearty way you rose to the challenge and the changes you have made in your organization toward becoming more financially sustainable and toward integrating giving into your organizational culture." Needless to say, we are deeply grateful to every single donor who helped make last year's campaign such a rousing success! And now on to our 2016 challenge.

Between now and December 31, 2016, COHI has the opportunity to earn as much as \$10,000 in a matching grant from our benefactor. This year's incentive is smaller than our 2015 match because our funder sees that our fundraising capacity has matured and assumes that we should be able to raise funds in excess of a dollar-for-dollar match. As such, we want to use this year's opportunity not only to realize the full \$10,000, but also generate at least an additional \$5,000 in gifts from individuals and an additional \$5,000 in gifts from other sources.

As you will see, every penny raised will be put to good use. In the weeks to come, we will be communicating much more about the 2017 goals and objectives that drive this next campaign, including the continued growth of centers, increased support for regional representatives, the move of the annual conference to Trinity University in San Antonio, and the hiring of a part-time Executive Director, which will in part help relieve our beloved founder of administrative burden, giving her more time to articulate the unique power of COHI's vision and mission, as only she can do.

Thank you again for helping ensure that COHI grows stronger in service and in spirit in the year ahead.
